

Dimma

(Swedish for mist)

This is a lace scarf knitted in two pieces that are sewn together in the middle so that the lace pattern shows in the same way on both sides of the scarf when worn.

The gauge is not very important unless you want to knit the scarf exactly as shown and using the one ball of Kidsilk Haze - there was very little yarn left when I had finished the scarf.

Specifications

Needles: 4,5 mm

Gauge: not important for the result but will affect the amount of yarn needed to finish the scarf. One repeat (13 stitches) measures around 7.5 cm wide and 6.5 cm long (unblocked measurements)

Yarn: Rowan Kidsilk Haze in Smoke (no. 605), one 25 g ball (I had very little left when I finished.)

Finished size: 140x24 cm

Difficulty level: easy-medium

Directions

The scarf is knitted in two pieces, from each side to the middle, and is then sewn together using kitchener stitch.

Cast on 43 stitches. The two first and two last stitches are knitted every round.

Knit one round

Next round (right side): knit 2, [13 stitches from the chart] three times, knit 2

Next round (wrong side): knit 2, purl until 2 stitches remain, knit 2.

Continue with the chart pattern until 10 repeats are finished.

Transfer stitches to a spare needle for later.

Repeat directions for an identical second part of the scarf.

Sew pieces together using kitchener stitch.

Alternatively, the scarf can be knitted until you're almost out of yarn; finish with one knit round from the wrong side and cast off.
